Often "free gifts" turn out to be something we can't use or don't need. Sometimes it's a more insidious approach, such as the "Gillette Principle" (give away razors, and make money on razor blades).

All of these things play on human gullibility and greed. Hardly a day goes past without my post containing something designed to tempt the "something-for-nothing" generation. In the end, we all pay. Most of the time, if we but knew it, we face inflated prices somewhere else. We pay the human cost of those who are tempted to over-extend themselves by offers of "free" prizes and "free" credit. We suffer the environmental effects of overproduction and excessive waste. There ain't no such thing as a free lunch!

Even the promise of Heaven isn't "free". It didn't come cheaply. It cost a lot of humility, obedience, pain and ultimately a cruel death. The good thing is that the price has already been paid, in a crib and on a cross.

CHUTE PARISH NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH SCHEME

DO WE WANT IT?

What sort of a daft question is that? Of course we want our Neighbourhood Watch Scheme. How else can we be sure we will be told about any possible problems such as local crime or something or someone suspicious? How else can we be sure that someone will keep an eye on things for us when we are out? Or, if we are going away for longer, that someone will also make sure there are no give-away signs for opportunist criminals – like the mailbox overflowing or deliveries left at the door. It doesn't take much effort – we just need to be a bit organised and look out for each other.

Well, that's the reaction I get around the Parish - and the Scheme still seems to be working after all these years - doesn't it? For example, my neighbours and I still have an arrangement to watch each other's house when we are away for a while. Unfortunately though it doesn't seem to stand up to closer scrutiny. For a start it turns out that the Local Co-ordinator published in the Chronicle is wrong – there isn't one! Tim Harker does look after Police liaison matters on top of his other Parish Council duties, but he has no formal role in the NW Scheme – no more than any of us. So, the vital routine liaison link to our professional Police is not actually in place.

Chute Parish Council is keen to do what it can to help 're-invigorate' the Scheme. To this end my Members propose to begin by confirming an up-to-date network of 'Local Contacts'. We can then arrange a Neighbourhood Watch meeting at which these contacts could take over and elect a 'Parish Co-ordinator'. Councillor Harker would then be happy to act in his Police Liaison role and help to reestablish the links with Wiltshire Police Neighbourhood Watch staff. To get the ball rolling would the following please get in touch with me as soon as you can – a telephone call on 730782 is fine:-

All the local contacts listed in the Chronicle – to say if you are happy to continue to take part in the Neighbourhood Watch Scheme – or at least to consider it.

<u>Any other folk</u> - to say if you might be interested in becoming a 'local contact' in the Scheme. As I said above, it's not very demanding but it does play a vital role in the community.

CHUTE CRICKET CLUB

We must be grateful for small mercies – our pitch has withstood the weather much better than many others including Worcestershire County CC which is out of use for the rest of the season – and they're professionals!

August can probably best be described as a varied month with all 4 games producing very different results!

- We played a Dan Staff Colts XI on Sunday 29th, beating them by only 4 runs. Paul Struthers top scored in Chute's 126 with 51, while Paul and Chris Stock shared the bowling honours (2 for 11 off 8 overs, and 2 for 19 off 5 overs respectively) restricting Dan's XI to 122 all out. A victory for CCC but, as importantly, it was wonderful to see a Junior XI playing so well in Chute.
- We also remain unbeaten against Inkpen CC; their pitch was water logged for the away fixture, and on probably the best day of the month weather-wise, they couldn't get a team together for the home fixture!
- In playing Linkenholt CC, away, we cannot escape the fact that we were soundly beaten by a better side, a Sunday side which is generally reckoned to be better than their League side, and which included a Hampshire Colt player. Again, Paul Struthers top scored in CCC's 98 for 8 in the allotted 35 overs, but this was not enough, the 'Holt' amassing 104 for 1 in only 13 overs.
- And finally, for the first time in its 5 year history, Chute CC's match against the Chris Stock Family XI was rained off, unfortunately not until some of the visitors had driven 130 miles!

Or won one, lost one, and unbeaten twice!

Two fixtures remain to complete our first expanded fixture list, and they're both very special. On Sunday 2nd we have a re-match against Linkenholt CC, at home; while on Sunday 9th, we're delighted to welcome back many 'old boys' of Chute CC to play the current batch of CCC cricketers – that should be a real Chute event. Everybody is welcome to support us at one or both matches.
