In all the ups and downs of life, we would do well to go back to the old Sunday School song:

Count your blessings, Name them one by one, And it will surprise you, What the Lord has done!

Whatever our worries, whatever our pain, this is an exercise which helps us have a more positive outlook on life. Try it!

Amenity Skip for Upper Chute

KDC have apologised for failing to provide the skip on 6th February – understandable in the circumstances. I have now re-booked a skip for the weekend beginning **Friday 20th March** – it will be sited on the Village Green at Upper Chute as usual. Please note this will be a general purpose skip – the content goes to landfill – so is not intended for recyclable materials. The Parish pays for this (albeit at a considerably subsidised rate) so it makes sense to make good use of it. However, please don't over-use it if you leave excess on the ground Kennet will have to make a separate trip to clear this and we will be charged.

Work by Wessex Water at Chute Reservoir

Intrigued by the cluster of vehicles etc at the reservoir, we wrote to Wessex Water to ask what they were up to. We have had a quick and polite response (4th February) to the effect that they are installing a temporary tank so that the existing reservoir can be taken out of service for cleaning and structural survey. They also noted that they had had to attend on site with a tanker to top up our holdings since the bulk supply from Southern Water had suffered due to a burst water main. We will try to encourage advance notice in future – it helps to know what is going on.

Grit Bins - Have your Say!!

We have recently had a number of comments to the effect that the grit bins have not been filled as often as was needed – also that arguably we should have more in the area. Co-incidentally we have been notified that WCC are beginning a County-wide review of the location, condition and use/need for the existing bins. Overall they intend to produce a better maintained and targeted service. They have promised to liaise with local Councils before deciding whether to remove any under-utilised bins and have asked us to co-ordinate and take a view on any requests for extra ones.

If you believe that any bins could be removed, or that additional bins are required, please send detail to me (what, where and why). An e-mail would be handy but a written note in my letter box would be fine. Your Parish Council can then co-ordinate all views and make a fully informed corporate case to the Wiltshire County Highways Staff.

(**Note**: Please remember that grit is not supplied for use on driveways/private land – it is solely for highway use. Shame that – I would have liked one at my house!)

Next Meeting of the Parish Council will take place on Thursday 12th March at 7.30pm – venue the Village Hall - you are welcome to attend. The agenda will be displayed around the Parish and the previous (draft) minutes will be displayed in advance on the Council notice board at the Village Hall.
